1. <u>Nature of the tasks</u>

The new approach of the Commission's work towards local authorities in the framework of the Multiannual Financial Framework (MFF) 2021-2027 and the Neighbourhood, Development and International Cooperation Instrument (NDICI), will imply to increase the thematic support to the EU Delegations and to the Geographical Directorates at headquarters on the territorial approach to local development/decentralisation processes and decentralised cooperation when preparing new programs.

DEVCO is looking for the recruitment of a free Seconded National Expert (SNE) based on a job description that highlights experience in analytic and conceptual work in the framework of policy formulation and implementation with emphasis on Local Governance, local development and Decentralised Cooperation in developing countries.

Under the overall supervision of the Head of Unit, the SNE will contribute to the implementation of these priorities. This will include in particular:

- Contributing to policy and programme development, coordination, monitoring and reporting activities to strengthen EU support activities for local authorities, decentralisation and decentralised cooperation ;

- Contributing to the preparation and formulation of programming documents and implementation actions;

- Contribute to the development and dissemination of knowledge in the field of local governance, local development and decentralised cooperation;

- Provide thematic guidance and support to Delegations and headquarters services on decentralisation, support to local authorities and decentralised cooperation;

- Contribute to the quality support process for programs including / concerning local authorities.

- Contribute to the work of the Unit on EU policy concerning the role of local authorities in development.

- Contribute to the horizontal tasks of the Unit (reporting, briefings, ...)

2. Main qualifications

a) Eligibility criteria

The following eligibility criteria must be fulfilled by the candidate in order to be seconded to the Commission. Consequently, the candidate who does not fulfil all of these criteria will be automatically eliminated from the selection process.

- <u>Professional experience</u>: at least three years of professional experience in administrative, legal, scientific, technical, advisory or supervisory functions which are equivalent to those of function group AD;
- <u>Seniority</u>: candidates must have at least one year seniority with their employer, that means having worked for an eligible employer as described in Art. 1 of the SNE decision on a permanent or contract basis for at least one year before the secondment;
- <u>Linguistic skills</u>: thorough knowledge of one of the EU languages and a satisfactory knowledge of another EU language to the extent necessary for the performance of the duties. SNE from a third country must produce evidence of a thorough knowledge of one EU language necessary for the performance of his duties.

b) Selection criteria

Professional experience

Relevant professional experience in formulation and/or implementation and/or evaluation of international cooperation policies, programmes and projects related to Local Authorities;

3. <u>Submission of applications and selection procedure</u>

Candidates should send their application according the **Europass** CV format to (http://europass.cedefop.europa.eu/en/documents/curriculum-vitae) in English, French or German only to the Permanent Representation / Diplomatic Mission to the EU of their country, which will forward it to the competent services of the Commission within the deadline fixed by the latter. The CV must mention the date of birth and the nationality of the candidate. Not respecting this procedure or deadlines will automatically invalidate the application.

Candidates are asked not to add any other documents (such as copy of passport, copy of degrees or certificate of professional experience, etc.). If necessary, these will be requested at a later stage. Candidates will be informed of the follow-up of their application by the unit concerned.

4. <u>Conditions of the secondment</u>

The secondment will be governed by the **Commission Decision** C(2008)6866 of 12/11/2008 laying down rules on the secondment to the Commission of national experts and national experts in professional training (SNE Decision). This decision is available on <u>http://ec.europa.eu/civil_service/job/sne/index_en.htm</u>.

The SNE will remain employed and remunerated by his/her employer during the secondment. He/she will equally remain covered by the national social security system.

Unless for cost-free SNE, allowances may be granted by the Commission to SNE fulfilling the conditions provided for in Art. 17 of the SNE decision.

During the secondment, SNE are subject to confidentiality, loyalty and absence of conflict of interest obligations, as provided for in Art. 6 and 7 of the SNE Decision.

If any document is inexact, incomplete or missing, the application may be cancelled.

Staff posted in a **European Union Delegation** are required to have a security clearance (up to SECRET UE/EU SECRET level according to Commission Decision (EU, Euratom) 2015/444 of 13 March 2015, OJ L 72, 17.03.2015, p. 53).

The selected candidate has the obligation to launch the vetting procedure before getting the secondment confirmation.

5. <u>Processing of personal data</u>

The selection, secondment and termination of the secondment of a national expert requires the Commission (the competent services of DG HR, DG BUDG, PMO and the DG concerned) to process personal data concerning the person to be seconded, under the responsibility of the Head of Unit of DG HR.DDG.B4. The data processing is subject to the SNE Decision as well as the Regulation (EU) 2018/1725.

Data is kept by the competent services for 10 years after the secondment (2 years for not selected or not seconded experts).

You have specific rights as a 'data subject' under Chapter III (Articles 14-25) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725, in particular the right to access, rectify or erase your personal data and the right to restrict the processing of your personal data. Where applicable, you also have the right to object to the processing or the right to data portability.
