For the most part, implementation of these pillars will be supported by Global Europe: Neighbourhood, Development and International Cooperation Instrument: NDICI. NDICI-Global Europe includes mandatory consultations of towns, regions and their associations in the elaboration of EU development programmes. It also dedicates a minimum of €500 million for towns and regions in partner countries.
